## Parent Partner Organizations Focused on Systems Involvement

Parent partner programs are designed to support parents and families who have active child welfare, behavioral health, or juvenile justice system involvement. The primary goal is to provide parents with consistent, non-judgmental, and kindred support as they build protective factors by engaging with individuals who formerly had system involvement. These individuals may be referred to as Parent Partners, Parent Mentors, Parent Allies, Peer Partners, Family Partners, and other titles that convey the important role that individuals with lived experience play in

the lives of families navigating various social systems. The following is an overview of agencies that focus on partnering with parents. Program descriptions are extrapolated from the respective program websites. We will include additional Parent Partner Programs to this evolving list.
